We accept only the following items in the store during business hours:

Yarn, Fabric (yardage only, no scraps), Canvases (new & used), Sketch Pads, Art Paints (no aerosols or house paint), Paint Brushes, Jewelry, Beads, Glue (no aerosols), Tape, National Geographic Magazines

## HOW TO DONATE:

- **Make sure we accept what you have.** Check out the lists of items on our website.
- **Organize your items** so we can see everything clearly when you drop it off. Bag like items together (ex: corks in one bag, bottlecaps in another). The more organized your donation is, the faster we will be able to get you in and out. Bring your donation in a bag, box, or container that can be left behind.
- **Ring the bell** at the Donations door or table (on SE Washington St, around the corner from the main entrance).
- **Be prepared to wait** while we look through your donation. We look through every donation to make sure we accept everything in it and reserve the right to reject any donations.
- We will email or give you a tax receipt and that good feeling that comes with supporting your local creative reuse nonprofit!

To leave your donation on the sidewalk at any time without checking in with a SCRAP team member **is considered dumping**, regardless of the items. This hurts our organization, our neighborhood, and our community; and it's against the law.

SCRAP PDX can't accept donations mailed to the store. All donations must be made in person.

## ITEMS WE GENERALLY ACCEPT: (Check the Website for Details)

### Fabric, Sewing, and Yarn

Fabric is one of the most donated items to SCRAP. Due to an overabundance, we must be selective about what we accept.

- Fabric must be AT LEAST 1 YARD of raw fabric with selvage (no hems!)
- Ideal fabric is colorful and/or patterned.
- NO fabric with holes, stains, mildew/mold, odors, started projects/stitches.
- NO clothing, towels, linens, curtains, tablecloths, etc.
- NO scraps or pieces smaller than 1 yard, unless specifically a fat quarter for quilting.

### Gift Wrap / Party Supplies / Holiday

- balloons
- gift wrap/wrapping paper
- gift bags
- greeting cards & envelopes (unused, no Christmas/holiday)
- holiday crafts and decorations (in season)
- lanterns
- party decorations
- party supplies
- raffia & Easter grass

## ITEMS WE NEVER ACCEPT: (Check the Website for Details)

- aerosols
- spray paint, paint pens, house paint
- flammable liquids, matches, batteries
- unlabeled/"mystery" liquids
- contaminated materials (including mold, rat/mouse poop, bugs or other pests)
- panes of clear sheet glass with no frame
- lightbulbs
- glass candle votives, mostly-used candles
- clothing, towels, sheets, linens, tablecloths or curtains of any kind or portion
- fabric with holes, odors, stains or pins
- fabric scraps (less than 1 yard)
- partial sewing projects
- dreamcatchers
- food
- single-use food related items - cups, cutlery, plates, napkins, etc.
- food containers - yogurt tubs, Tupperware, take-out containers, vitamin bottles, cardboard canisters
- flat gift boxes
- utensils/cutlery
- kitchen gear, pots & pans
- broken glassware, dishware, ceramics (unless vintage china)
- household goods, appliances, furniture
- flooring, lumber, plywood
- metal
- non-patterned tile, tile larger than 6"x6"
- gardening tools, flower pots, live or fresh flowers/plants, dried flowers/plants
- packing peanuts, styrofoam
- plastic pieces (other than plexiglass)
